

Remote Learning 2021/22 Action Plan.

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg, laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

Each Class has been setup with their own MS TEAMS Channel outlining the Remote Learning, access points to resources linked to lessons and connection to Live Lessons delivered. You will find your child's channel has been linked via email to yourselves as parents, giving you access to Daily Acts of Worship, Live lessons and resources to support those lessons presented.

Below is an overview of lessons to be completed each day via MS TEAMS or similarly through paper-based learning packs pre-requested through the school office. Our overview will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

We use a variation of resourcing to support these sessions and enhance the learning experience for all our children. We utilise many links (as seen opposite) to share and engage our pupils in becoming independent learners through a love of reading, writing and sharing their ideas. Below is an outline of some ways in which we facilitate this;</p> <p>Reading Reading is everything. Read as much as you can at home as we celebrate our Year of Reading. Children are to read from their own reading book or download and read a free e-book from Oxford Owls- parents will be contacted with the correct Oxford Level for their child. We are now also able to support and follow this up with our BugPhonics and reading package.</p> <p>Writing A brilliant, fun and entertaining way to write. We link to many different resources online in the classroom which enables us to provide a similar experience via MS TEAMS through Live lessons.</p> <p>We use White Rose Maths which have a wealth of visual and engaging videos; lesson slides; activities and their own style of workbooks. We encourage all our children to go deeper and submerge themselves in their learning</p>

		<p>through the range of online and paper based activities presented .</p> <p>We have a very active MYMaths school web platform which enables all pupils to access learning set by their teacher linked to their current teaching topics.</p> <p>We also use Learning by Questions in Key Stage 2 enabling pupils to be tracked live during a lesson, providing on the spot feedback and support to their learning. This tool also assessing the pupils throughout their responses setting questions to consolidate or move pupils on.</p>

Feel free to do extra.</p> <p>Children are given a breadth of experience through Live Lessons delivered in MS TEAMS. Teachers prepare slideshows; Organise Assignments; Upload Quizzes; Provide access to resources through their MS TEAMS class channel – lessons even provide the ability to ‘Break-Out’ into chat groups to discuss learning; differentiate tasks; consolidate learning and provide opportunities of well-being.</p> <p>All our children are encouraged to access the learning online where possible; take brain breaks whilst also being inspired to go beyond our expectations through topic based learning.</p>

The Oak National Academy.

The ‘teaching content’ will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources

site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via the school office admin email, enquiries@st-norberts.lincs.sch.uk

However, children in Yr2 and KS2 are able to present aspects of their learning requested by teachers via the 'Assignment' link in their class channel. Utilising the learning platforms and Apps currently in school enables a great deal of feedback to be given verbally via the chat bar or work to be shared via web-cams, additionally, some Apps mark and feedback electronically in real time.

Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone or the school admin email address. Teachers will email back feedback if required, BCC copying the Headteacher into any correspondence. Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical ground for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted on a weekly basis by their Class teacher and support offered as necessary.

Additional live lessons to those we currently offer will be signposted by teachers to the National Oak Academy should pupils wish to extend or consolidate their understanding further.
