Marking and Feedback

What is the purpose of Marking and Feedback?

Marking and feedback is an integral part of teaching and learning. It is how we and our pupils that progress is being made with their learning.

As teachers it provides us with information that helps us to plan future lessons that will best support the children in our class to achieve and deepen their understanding. It helps us with our on going assessment, enabling us to build up evidence which demonstrates how children have progressed.

Are children given opportunities to assess their own and others learning?

Our aim is to create independent learners who are able to reflect on their own and others learning and make evaluations of the progress they are making. In school we have a visual marking code policy which children are taught how to use. Through this they understand and can respond to the feedback they are given. Also, when asked they can assess their own or others work. Peer assessment occurs predominantly in KS2 classes and all children throughout the school are able to self-assess in some form.

What do teachers mark and how do we give your child feedback?

We use the marking policy outlined on the next page to mark every piece of work in every subject using the key symbols and / or written comments when appropriate. Oral feedback is of vital importance as children receive immediate responses and know where they need to go next.

This is particularly useful in subjects such as PE in which children need to be told how successful they have been.
