

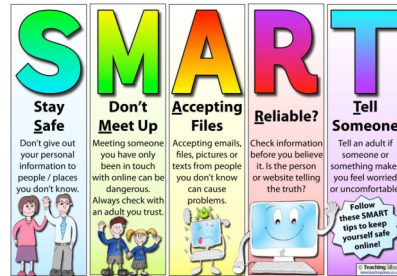
Designated Safeguarding Leads
