World Book Day - Thursday 2nd March 2023



What is renewable energy?

Renewable energy uses energy sources that are not "used up". For example, solar power from the sun is renewable as we wont" use up" all the sunlight from the sun. Examples of non-renewable energy sources include fossil fuels like coal and oil. Once we use or burn these resources, they are gone forever.

Why is renewable energy important?

Much of the world relies on non-renewable energy to heat their homes, power their electronic devices, and power their cars. Once these energy sources are used up, they will be gone forever. Developing technologies that can efficiently use renewable energy sources is critical to our future.
