Year 3: In Year Three the children learn about how we live in love. The children will know and understand the virtues essential to friendship e.g. loyalty, responsibility etc. and experience the importance both of forgiving and being forgiven and of celebrating God's forgiveness.

Year 4: In Year 4 the children learn about how God loves us in our differences. The children will know and understand that they are all different and celebrate these differences as they appreciate that God's love accepts us as we are and as we change.

Year 5: In Year Five the children learn about God loving them in their changing and development. The children will know and become aware of the physical and emotional changes that accompany puberty-sensitivity, mood swings, anger, boredom etc. and grow further in their understanding of God's presence in their daily lives.

During the Pentecost Term of Year 5 the first phase of the programme will be delivered. This focuses upon body changes in puberty, boy's changes, menstruation, health and hygiene and 'what kind of person do I want to be?'

Year 6: In Year 6 the children learn about the wonder of God's love in creating new life. The children develop, in an appropriate way for their age, an understanding of sexuality and grow further in their appreciation of their dignity and worth as children of God.

During the Advent Term of Year 6 the second phase of the programme focuses on revision/recap of Year 5, conception of a baby and the growth of an unborn baby.

Parents continue to have *the right to withdraw* their children from Sex Education except in those elements which are required by the National Curriculum science orders. Should parents wish to withdraw their children they are asked to notify the school by contacting the Headteacher. The school will provide support by providing material for parents to help the children with their learning.

Programme of Study

Our programme is A Journey in Love, a resource created by Sister Jude Groden of BRES. It is the recommended programme of study for Catholic schools for Sex and Relationship Education, and has been written as a progressive scheme of work that supports the Religious Education, PSHE and Science curricula taught within the school.

EYFS: The children learn about God loving each of us in our uniqueness. The children will know and understand that God has made them unique and that although we are all different, we are special to him.
