

MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHE

Here we are at the start of another new term, I hope you have all had a restful Easter break and looking forward to the lighter evenings and signs of spring, our school grounds are starting to bloom beautifully.

We have had a busy start to the term, despite it being only a 4 day week, so have lots to share with you and celebrate. Class newsletters outlining your child's topics and key vocabulary for the term will be sent home today, we hope you find these useful for discussing and supporting learning at home.

We are very pleased to welcome back Miss Bools to Year 6, following her injury and thank Mrs Szczygiel, for her hard work in teaching and supporting the class in her absence. Miss Bools, is also well deserving of the reader of the week award, having read a whopping 40 books while convalescing. Come on Year 6, are you up for the challenge?

This week in Art, Year 6 have been learning about different vases throughout history. They have learnt the key vocabulary for the structure of a vase: lip, neck, body and foot.

Year 5 have been busy investigating soluble and insoluble materials in Science, taking part in a practical investigation exploring which material dissolve and which materials do not. We also started our recorder lessons in music and were able to learn about different instruments from the woodwind family. Everyone was very excited to open our new, class set of recorders and explore our very own woodwind instrument, exploring tone holes and finger placement.

Year 4 have been learning about the Plague and the village of Eyam in Derbyshire. This was the only place where the plague spread to outsidenof London. Children have had great fun researching so called cures for the disease which included drinking herbs and applying leaches to boils.

Year 3 have been looking at the book "The Garden" by Dyan Sheldon and have learnt about arrowheads, Indians and flint. We have been using dictionaries.

In Year 2 this week we have been learning about the Spanish Artist Joan Miro. We have created our very own 'Joan Miro' styled artwork using big bold lines and imaginative shapes.

Year 1 have enjoyed delving into maths. From quick-fire mental maths to fun in the sun while counting. The children loved using their knowledge of multiples of ten to find their scores when aiming beanbags at a target. In art, Year 1 are excited to begin learning about printing and print designers. They were particularly taken with Orla Kiely and Duro Olowu's designs- using mixed media to explore the patterns and shapes they spotted in some of their work.

In English, EYFS have been rehearsing the story Rosie's Walk focusing on positional language. We have been looking at numbers beyond 10 using 10 frames for example 1 whole ten and 1 ones is 11. We have learnt about life cycles and listened to the story of Pentecost too!
