MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

The Bishops of England and Wales ask each of us to pray for His Majesty, King Charles III and the Queen. As we look towards the Coronation Day, which will be marked with joy and celebration across England and Wales, and the Commonwealth, let us commend King Charles and Queen Camilla to our Heavenly Father, that he may sustain them in their duties all the days of their lives. It has been wonderful to mark the occasion with Coronation activities, including a themed lunch assembly and regal dress up day.

In addition, the children have been working as hard as ever. Despite the bank holiday and Polling day it has been wonderful to celebrate their achievements and share with you what they have been busy doing. In Reception, they have continued looking at numbers beyond 10 and how 24 is made up of two ten and four ones and have been matching and filling shapes and replicating models. They have started a new book called Pigs Might Fly, which is the story of what happened next after the story of the Three Little Pigs and the Big Bad Wolf. They have also learnt about the life cycle of a plant and during our Pentecost topic for RE they have moved on to celebrate the churches birthday.

Year 1 have been busy wondering how the Holy Spirit helps them and makes them feel. They came up with wonderful answers such as peaceful, joyful, compassionate. They then considered ways they can share this good news with other. We hope you keep an eye out for the Year 1 children demonstrating kindness, inclusion, patience and some self-control!

This week in Year 2, they have been learning about Fractions in Maths, drafting their Information writing about plants in English and also learning about Joan Miro sculptures in Art! Why not check out our Year 2 Twitter messages to see some of their sculptures.

Year 3 have been writing Diamante poems and listening to rhyming words. In music, they have created an 8 beat rhythm using body percussion and producing beat box sounds. The children were fantastic at the beat boxing and we hope they demonstrate this to their parents/carers, they were amazing. Year 4 have been really busy this week using their knowledge of decimals to help them write different amounts of money.

This week Year 5 have been busy refining their recorder skills learning two extra notes g and a! They worked so hard to stay in time with each other and play as a mini orchestra and everyone wanted to showcase their skills and play a mini solo to the class at the end of the lesson. It was wonderful to see the encouragement and support the children offered to each other. In PE we have been learning about the roles and responsibilities of the backstop position and base-fielders in rounders.

This week Year 6 have had fun in Maths learning about angles in a triangle, using protractors and applying rules to solve problems. With SATs week almost upon us, we wish them every success and are incredibly proud of each and every one of them in all that they do.

We hope you all have another restful bank holiday weekend, enjoy the Coronation celebrations and we look forward to seeing you all on Tuesday.


A Little Dose of Nature - Dr. Alison Greenwood
