

1ESSAGE FROM MRS WITHEF

EYFS have been learning about fewer and more and have looked at the phonemes g, o, c, and k. They have also collecting leaves in order to create leaf men pictures.

Year 1 have been wonderful gymnasts this week. The children have learned about different types of jumps including straight, star and tuck jumps. The children explored different ways to travel along apparatus at different levels and heights and demonstrated excellent control when incorporating different jumps into their sequences.

This week Year 2 have been learning about Place Value in Maths and beginning to understand the value of each digit in a two digit number. They have also been climbing the Little Red Reading Hood story mountain planner, creating their own retelling of the story verbally ready to write a similar story. Finally, the Year 2's have been learning to plan and plot routes around their locality using compass bearings of North, East, South and West.

Year 3 were looking at topographical features on a map and in atlas in Geography this week and did well comparing our county of Lincolnshire and Derbyshire they were very interested in the difference to the counties that are so close to one another, well done! I also would like to say well done to our year 3 girl footballers who played in the tournament and made us all very proud!

Year 4 have been listening to a piece of Brazilian popular music entitled Toca Bonito. They have been learning to play a composition on glockenspiels using the notes 'c to g' to accompany their singing of the chorus.

In an exciting week of music exploration, Year 5 have been honing their note-reading skills on a musical stave. They've learnt new musical notation essential for their performances on recorders and glockenspiels. With precision timing, they've harmoniously played in unison, following the conductor's downbeat. Furthermore, some of our talented pupils have even begun to experiment with melodies against the backing track. Super harmonies Year 5.

This week Year 6 worked on creating their own Class Worship. They planned the content and songs themselves and were keen to share some of the beautiful work that they have been doing as part of their topic- Loving. They even shared some things that they learnt from The Briars residential last week.

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK



Jesus came to share the Good News and to bring God's message to all people. He wanted them to learn how to live in the love of God and one's neighbour, and to know what mattered most in life. Many people did not listen, so Jesus told them that he would give his message to others.

Prophets are often unpopular because they bring messages that are uncomfortable and challenging. Who are the prophets of the present age, and what are they telling us? How have we received their messages and what have we done about them? What is the message the world most needs today? The message of today's Gospel too is blunt and we should reflect on how we have received it, Jesus calls himself the 'keystone' or most important stone that supports the rest of the building. What have been the 'keystones' in your life in the past and the present? What are the things which you have rejected, and why? Think about being fruitful in your life, and think about three specific ways you can be fruitful during the week.

This term we focus on Encounter

Mary, Mother of God - she encountered God in a very personal way, through the Holy Spirit coming down upon her to enable the Incarnation to take place. She, through her courage to say yes to God, enabled all of us to encounter Jesus, by bringing him into the world, but also by caring for him, loving him and guiding him as his mother.

Whatsapp Guidance



Most Social media apps are for pupils 13 years and over, however, Whatsapp is for pupils 16+. If you or a family member have already set this up on your child's phone or opened an account for your child then you have already breached the Terms and Conditions for using this app – it might be time to read the Terms and Conditions for Whatsapp again. If you do allow your child to access social media, we ask for your vigilance; we ask for your support and most importantly we ask that you take responsibility for how and what your child is messaging to others.

Just like their interactions in person, online interactions require supervision and support. We understand that they are growing up and require a level of privacy and personal space, however, they are using an app aimed at pupils of 16 years +, therefore we still need to guide and support their use in this online area.

What is right will vary from family to family but some strategies that are known to be successful include:

• Monitoring their phones for the apps that are downloaded

• Enacting parental controls on phones and consoles

• Reviewing the messages they send on platforms and apps – making monitoring part of a daily or weekly routine

• Setting expectations about what space (preferably communal) and times they have access to devices

• Encouraging them to share or discuss with you what they are doing.


