E-SAFETY FROM ALAN MACKENZIE

Survey - Children's Digital Wellbeing

On 25th Jan Internet Matters released their annual, Children's Digital Wellbeing survey. The report is always insightful and useful, giving a wider understanding of the bigger concerns of parents.

Some key points from the survey are:

Children:

- Children feel less affected by online harms than they did in last year in relation to content that is upsetting or scary, 24% vs 35% in 2022, but this is still a quarter.
- 60% of children say that being online makes them feel like they're part of a group, and 75% view technology and the internet as important to their independence.

Parents:

- More parents are moderating their children's online activity with 21% of parents managing their children's usage a lot.
- More parents are talking to their children about what they are doing online and more children are talking to their parents after encountering various potential harms.



CURRICULUM FACTS, ACTIVITIES AND CHALLENGES

<u>Geography</u>

1) Glaciers are huge masses of ice that "flow" like very slow rivers. They form over hundreds of years where fallen snow compresses and turns into ice.

- 2) Glaciers form the largest reservoir of fresh water on the planet. In fact, they store 75% of the world's fresh water!
- 3) Today, glaciers cover around 10% of the Earth's total land area. During the last ice age they covered 32%
- 4) Glaciers are usually divided into two groups Alpine glaciers, which form on mountainsides and move downward through valleys, and Continental ice sheets, which spread out and cover larger areas.
- 5) The world's largest glacier is Lambert Glacier, located in Antarctica, measuring approximately 100km wide, 400km long and 2.5km deep!
- 6) Because glacial ice is so dense and compact, it often appears a bright blue colour!
