A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

Foundation have been looking at numbers beyond ten, learning that they are made up of one full ten and ones. They have been learning about farm animals and their babies and matching them. They have been writing the story of Rosie's Walk too!

In art this week, we have been learning about how to use objects for printing and practised a technique called over printing, inspired by print designers Karen Lederer, Duro Olowu and Lucienne Day. The children were so careful with their pressing, the prints worked superbly!

In Year 2 this week we have been learning to use and apply Diamante poem format within our Concrete poem structures. We have been looking at Heart shaped poems, Leaf shaped poems and Tree shaped poems. We have been learning how to roll and aim at targets in PE and increase the accuracy of hitting the target each time. In Art we have been finding out more about Joan Miro and creating our own pieces of artwork.

Year 3 enjoyed getting messy whilst creating their mosaic tile in clay, copying their paper design.

Year 4 have had a very exciting week collecting and sketching man-made and natural textures for their art project.

This week Year 5 have been exploring the work of the influential artist William Morris. We have considered the features of his work and created some of our own sketches of his work.

This week Year 6 have been learning about evolution in Science. They have explore how fossils give evidence for evolution as well as how and why there may be gaps in the fossil record. This has followed on from the previous session where they investigated Darwin's work on the Theory of Evolution and his work on the adaptation in finches beaks based on their diet.

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

Have you ever done any gardening and chopped branches of a plant or a tree because they were making the plant unhealthy?

This weekend we hear how Jesus compares himself to a vine and us to its branches. He tells us how we need to stay connected otherwise the branch could die.

Jesus continues to speak to the disciples through imagery which they understood from their everyday experience and with symbols that come from their Jewish tradition. The vine is a staple part of Israel's agricultural life. It carries the idea of the life which flows into the branches from the thick stalk of the vine. Jesus becomes that giver of life and prosperity, but behind his life-giving presence is the Father. Like the vine-dresser, the Father must cut away anything which impedes that life or comes from a source that is not nourished from the 'true vine.' Jesus exists to make the Father known and so it must be with the disciples of Jesus. We must 'remain with Jesus and thus make the Father known.
