A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

In Foundation this week we have been able to get outside and enjoy the beautiful sunshine giving us a change to improve our gross motor skills.

This week, Year 1 have been putting together some fantastic rhino facts, sorting the information into categories and writing an introduction. The tricky part is using different openers so it doesn't sound too repetitive. We had lots of laughs when reading Miss Whyles' terrible version out loud. Rhino... rhino....rhino.... was apparently not very effective!

This week in Year 2 we have been learning about thirds and quarters in our Maths fraction topic. We have been learning how to find a fraction of an amount and use and apply our understanding to solve problems. We have also been extending our ideas in English to write and compose our own concrete (Shape) poems about trees, hearts and lolly-pops! In Art we are learning to create our very own Juan Miro sculptures using different shaped pieces of card. Finally, we also enjoyed learning and practising our Class Worship on Wednesday - we challenged ourselves to try and memorise our lines in one day!

This week in Year 3 the children had great fun with our science filtration investigation outside. They were very intrigued about how this works.

Year 4 have been exploring the properties of mod roc as apart of their art learning. Children will be making natural sculptures later on in the term using this material.

This week Year 5 have been researching human and physical features of Eastern European countries. They were very successful in identifying and discussing similarities and differences between these countries and the United Kingdom.

This week in Year 6 the children have been developing their throwing skills in PE. They have been learning to use an overarm technique to bowl a ball in Kwik Cricket with increasing control and accuracy. They also practiced overarm throwing skills for distance and power as part of fielding skills and returning the ball back to the wicket keeper as quickly as possible.


Mrs Withers Weekly Challenge Area: This week near the hall children can explore developing their fine motor skills to create different amounts and to create 2D Shapes...

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

Jesus knew he would soon die and rise to new life – this was a sign of his love for everyone. He also knew his disciples would not understand the things that would happen, so he told them how much he loved them and asked them to share this love with others.

But the love that Jesus talks about in this week's Gospel is about obedience, willing co-operation, and sacrifice which produces joy. We could quite easily misinterpret what Jesus says here. He is not saying that his love will depend on whether we obey or not. That would be a love that is conditional. Obedience in the mind of Jesus is that surrender of will that can only flow from the absolute security of knowing ourselves loved and cherished by a God who wants the best for us and for those around us. Such surrender brings joy and freedom and a delight in 'obeying' commands and living the loving way.

New Report - Teen Girls' Experiences of Harm Online

Internet Matters have released their latest Digital Wellbeing Index report showing that teen girls experience significantly more negative outcomes online than other children.

The report goes onto quite a lot of good detail, but some key takeaways are:

- -The online world is vital for social connection and social media encourages creativity.
- -Harassment of girls has become normalised for some parents and girls.
- -This harassment includes hateful comments, bullying and inappropriate messages/images from men.
- -Although social media can be positive and encourage creativity, it is also a source of sadness and social pressure, including being worried about their body shape or size.


Little Snail's Book of Bugs- Yuval Zommer

Oceans, Rivers and lakes facts


- 1. The largest ocean on Earth is the Pacific Ocean. This covers 63 million km.
