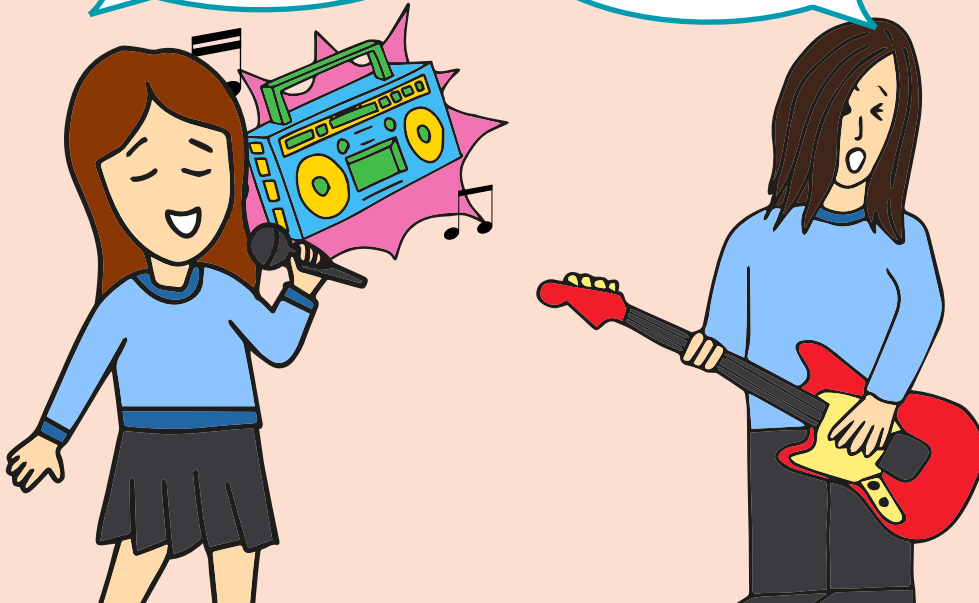


Sentence structure and phrases

J'aime la musique pop mais je déteste la musique classique

Moi, je n'aime pas la musique jazz, je préfère la musique rock



I like pop music but I hate classical music

Me, I don't like jazz music, I prefer rock music

Key phrases

When saying what instrument you play, Jouer - to play is followed by 'de' + instrument

de changes depending on the definitive article le/la/les of the instrument.

de + le = du

de + la = de la

de + les = des

de + l' = de l'

Tu joues d'un instrument? - Do you play an instrument?

Je joue du piano

Je joue de la batterie

I play the piano

I play the drums

Changing a sentence into the negative form:
Place **ne ... pas** around the verb

Je **ne** joue **pas** d'instrument

I don't play an instrument
