At St. Norbert's we foster a happy, dynamic learning environment, built on a tradition of care and excellence, where children are encouraged and nurtured to achieve their best.

Throughout the school, children benefit from the vibrant learning centred classrooms and the cosy, well-resourced library complete with a storytelling wood and Narnia area, enables children to enjoy reading for pleasure. Our nurture spaces for pastoral support include a wellresourced classroom space, where children benefit from drawing and talking, art and Lego therapy sessions when needed. In addition, The galaxy sensory room provides opportunities for pupils to regulate in a safe sensory environment.

Our beautiful grounds include a nature area equipped with outdoor classroom, storytelling circle and fruit and vegetable garden, perfect for facilitating outdoor learning. The playground is well-equipped with a trim trail, climbing wall and exercise equipment, as well as a spacious sports field.

In addition, our youngest children in early years have a safe and stimulating environment in which to learn in a wellresourced classroom and a dedicated early years area with water play, gardening, bikes and trikes and mud kitchen.

Our curriculum

At St. Norbert's we strive for a curriculum that is accessible to all and develops the whole child. It nurtures spirituality, curiosity, creativity and enjoyment.

Our golden threads of equality, excellence and ambition weave through all areas of our curriculum and enable children to secure knowledge and skills and deepen their conceptual understanding.

To enable everyone to flourish and achieve their ambition at our school, our knowledge rich, rounded and coherent curriculum, aims to equip our children with the information, skills, vocabulary, and personal characteristics which will help to ensure they can become lifelong learners and make a positive contribution to the communities they belong to.

We strive to provide practice in which our pupils develop that capacity to assess and improve work, sustain effort over time, exceed what they thought was possible and work well with others to combine ideas and approaches.

Teaching and Learning

At St. Norbert's teachers endeavour to plan exciting, memorable learning experiences, which enable our pupils to have a depth of knowledge and understanding. Children are taught as a whole class, in sets, groups and as individuals.

As an inclusive school, we work in partnership with parents to identify and support children with additional needs, whether their needs are around communication and interaction, cognition and learning, social, emotional and mental health or sensory and/or physical difficulties.

The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENDCO) works closely with the class teachers and outside agencies to ensure that the child's needs are met. Parents are encouraged to engage with school as we support children through an individualised program.

All children with SEND are fully integrated into school life and are educated within the classroom setting to ensure they have access to a full and broad curriculum.

Catholic social teaching and British values

We have British Value and Protected Characteristic of the Week and Friday Celebration Worship is underpinned by a 3 year Reading Spine with quality texts that bring these themes to life for our pupils. Through Catholic Social Teaching and virtues and values that underpin the mission and behaviour policy of our school, we support children to learn right from wrong and understand that our actions have consequences.

Beyond the curriculum

At St Norbert's, we value the uniqueness of all our pupils and establish an ethos that develops the 'whole child'.

Our pupils are encouraged to take risks and build resilience. They are encouraged to be inquisitive lifelong learners who question and explore the world around them.

Our nurturing staff recognise and support a diversity of needs relating to learning, health, mental wellbeing, behaviour as well as emotional and physical requirements ensuring that all our pupils feel safe, secure and are able to aspire to be the very best they can be.

Developing the whole child

Trips and Experiences

At St. Norbert's we believe that our children benefit significantly from visiting places of interest and we know these experiences will broaden children's horizons and deepen their learning. We run regular trips to residential facilities, museums, local points of interest, theatres and sports venues. In addition, we aim to provide enriching workshops to further enhance our children's experiences and complement our curriculum.

After School Clubs

We are always looking at new and interesting ways to extend and enrich the learning. Across the school year, staff provide a range of clubs which focus on developing skills. furthering knowledge and having fun.

Clubs run from 3.15pm until 4.15pm. There is an expectation that children will remain in the same club for the term. This will enable them to fully participate in the activities and gain from the experience.

Some clubs that we currently offer include; football, multi-sports, choir, computing, crafts and reading. We also offer children the chance to learn to play musical instruments such as the piano and guitar.

Wrap-around care

We offer childcare from 7.30am until the start of the school day where children can enjoy sporting activities, games and crafts. Children are served breakfast including cereals and toast.

Achieving full potential and personal development

There are several opportunities for our children to exercise their leadership skills and action our British Values by showing commitment to roles throughout the school, parish and wider community.

School Councillors

Each year, representatives from each class from Year 2 upwards are voted by their peers to become School Councillors. These pupils attend a termly meeting to discuss school initiatives, consult on school policies and support whole school events.

Reading Ambassadors

Reading Ambassadors apply for the role each year to actively work within our school to share their love of reading. Our Reading Ambassadors take on a number of roles including lunchtime story time with Early Years and Key stage 1 and leading on whole school reading initiatives including Poetry Day and World Book Day.

Chaplaincy Team

The Chaplaincy team play a vital role in enhancing and promoting the school virtues and Gospel values alongside our faith to pupils, staff and the wider community. All of our chaplains take joy in carrying out their responsibilities.

This will establish deep rooted and uncompromising attributes that will permeate through our local community and beyond to create intercultural understanding and respect.
