# A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

What a Week, we are so proud of how the Foundation children are coming into school and learning new rules and routines. They have enjoyed lots of listening and phonics games, learnt a song about the Three Billy Goat's Gruff with actions and enjoyed a music session with Mrs Carr!

In RE, Year 1 children learned to look closely at the world around them and found themselves in awe and wonder of all the things they found. We spotted single strings of spiderwebs, tint seeds of dandelions and so much more! There was careful recording and excited talk about the amazing things in creation.

In Year 2 this week we have been retelling the story of the Building Boy in our own words, learning to extend our sentences with adjectives and use key vocabulary. In our Maths learning we have been partitioning tens and ones, finding missing numbers and calculating addition and subtraction problems. The class have been praised for their kindness and consideration towards each other through our PSHCE lessons and also in and around the school. Well done Year 2.

Year 3 had a great time working in teams in the nature area creating a range of homes using twigs and leaves. We then discussed the variety of homes that we can live in.

Year 4 have had a great week learning new skills in PE. They have been practising their look, run avoid strategies to help learn how to play contact sports such as tag rugby. They have also been developing their pass, position and patience skills to help develop their understanding of hockey.

This week in Year 5, we have been learning about forces. We have discussed different types of forces and are preparing to write our own explanation text about them.

This week Year 6 have started settling into their new roles and responsibilities. They have made a great start in their Maths learning developing their knowledge and understanding of numbers up to ten million in numerals and words. They have been using place value and Gattegno charts to identify and spot patterns when exploring powers of ten, discussing how digits move when multiplied or divided by a power of ten.

You may have noticed the new road markings and signs outside school along Tollgate. Please follow the parking regulations as set out. # GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

This week, we hear Jesus asking his followers a difficult question: "Who do you think I am?" Listen carefully, and see which disciple gave the right answer.



There is a message here for us all, not to let the stumbling blocks of our everyday lives get in the way of our journey to God. We do say "yes" with Peter and the others: "You are the Christ" and hosanna and hooray! but when the going gets tough and we are called upon to be suffering servants in our turn aren't we like Peter then too, don't we begin then to draw the line and say, that is not what I meant, this is not it at all, this is not for me at all, this is where I jump off, I draw the line here. Not if we are followers of the true Messiah, Jesus Christ who died for us on a cross, Jesus who said "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine let them take their cross and follow me." There is nothing in Jesus message about if it suits you or when you are ready or if it's not too hard for you or only on Sundays or feast days. Now is the time, always is the time. Look at the cross of Jesus what does it teach us? If we are looking for a triumphant Christianity we must look closely at the way Jesus triumphed, look at the woman at the well story, the story of Martha's family, the story of Peter's life, in these stories and all the smaller stories surrounding the life of Jesus we discover Jesus' way "I am meek and humble of heart" To accept the cross means to live as Jesus did.
