Foundation have enjoyed reading an interactive pizza recipe book and ordering instructions. The children loved making pizzas! They have enjoyed an Advent Betreat morning making star decorations and Christmas cards! The children are doing an amazing job learning songs and actions for the nativity.

Year 1 loved learning all about the Advent wreath. They enjoyed seeing it be put together and finding out what the different means of each element represented. They produced some beautiful writing to describe these while listening to calming choral music. So peaceful for such young children.

This week in Year 2 we have been discussing and organising our class worship. We looked at Christ The king and sha<mark>red ideas and</mark> thoughts on how we could portray this key information that we need to listen to God's word and share his love through our actions. We have also been rehearsing our Nativity songs and lines to improve our stage presence in order to share this wondrous story and all its glory. We have also been enjoying an Advent retreat where we were able to reflect on Jesus being the light of the world. We were able to craft and create our very own cards and 3D stars!

The children in Year 3 had a great time at their Forest School Day on Wednesday, they were able to use cross curricular themes and because they were in the wood area, took the opportunity to re-enact the discovery of the tree man from our book in English "Our Tower". The children enjoyed telling me about his.

The children also demonstrated how to create a triangular shape using the lever balance method and made pyramids using sticks. The children have thoroughly enjoyed their ICT lesson by creating stop motion animation stories.

Year 4 had a fabulous morning on Thursday as they enjoyed their Advent retreat with Mrs Wright. Children made stars to represent Jesus as the light if the world, Christmas cards to be donated to the local community and write Advent promises.

In Year 5 we have been learning about World War II. This week we explored rationing. We were amazed at how little people had to work with to create their weekly meals. We had a go at creating our own meal plan based on rations from the time. It wasn't as easy as we expected!

This week Year 6 have been planning and writing their own poem based on the classic poem Night Mail by W.H Auden. The theme for their poetry writing was a more modern form of mail- emails. They worked on developed rhyming pairs that they could use in their poetry as well as planning out ideas about emails including: how they are sent, technical equipment, who might receive emails, to name but a few ideas. They also worked on including figurative language in their writing, such as personification, metaphors and similes.

UNIFORM-Just a reminder we are now in our winter uniforms, which should include all children wearing a shirt and tie. You can now also order the new St. Norbert's hoodie from our uniform provider. The Hoodies are for PE Days and Outdoor learning days they are not a replacement for school jumpers or cardigans.

It is such a special time of the year at school and this Thursday we were able to prepare beautifully for the start of Advent with our Whole School Retreat Day, my thanks to the Chaplaincy Team and Mrs Wright our school chaplain for creating such a special experience

Roblox Tightens Safety Measures

Roblox, one of the most popular games around the world, has been under a lot of fire lately for a whole host of reasons, such as highly inappropriate games accessible to young children, questionable moderation, significant grooming concerns and more.

At its most basic, Roblox is a platform where any user can create games and one of the biggest concerns is that none of these user-generated games have required an age rating system. That's about to change, from mid-December creators will have to content-rate their games. Whilst a positive step it still raises lots of questions, such as:

- Is anyone checking these ratings?
- What about games prior to mid-December?
- Will there be enhanced moderation?
- and more.

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It's a positive step forward but much more needs to be done by Roblox and other

platforms to help parents with keeping their children safe. You can read more

FACTS AND CHALLENGES

Charge for bags a success for British beaches!

There is good news! Far fewer plastic bags are now littering our beaches according to the Marine Conservation Society. The charity has been monitoring beach rubbish for 30 years, there new survey has revealed that the number of plastic bags washing up on British beaches has dropped by 80% in the last decade.

The Marine Conservation Society think this is due to the UK government introduction of a charge for carrier bags. This charge gets shoppers to pay for single-use plastic bags and encourages the reuse of bags. The charity hopes future surveys will show a drop in pollution from other litter items, like plastic cutlery and polystyrene cups, which have been banned or restricted in the last two years. Let's keep our fingers crossed there is a positive impact to protect our wildlife both on shore and offshore.

Word of the week: pollution- means waste products or heat that damage the environment in some way.


