In Maths, Year 1 have been enjoying learning about 3d and 2d shapes. They've been on shape hunts, made towers, sorted shapes and created shape pictures. What a lot of vocabulary and interest they've demonstrated. Well done!

Year 2 have been enjoying a week of addition in maths calculating larger numbers and crossing ten have been working on adding two -two digit numbers which cross the ten and using our strategy to calculate ones and tens (36 + 27). Maybe you'd like to practice at home over the Christmas holiday? We have also been learning about John McAdam in history and finding out how roads were made. In our Design Technology the children have been creating their Great Fire of London Structures to lift a bucket of water using flanges and bracing reinforcement. Finally, we have been singing Christmas carols and sharing the joy of Jesus birth as we crafted and created our very own cards.

The Year 3 children have really enjoyed making frosty the snowman this week and were delighted when they were able to take them home.

Year 4 have had a great time in PE this week learning how to dance in sequences to the beat of Daff Punk 'All Around the World'

In Year 5 this week we have been working hard to finish our DT projects. We have been making aprons for our topic of 'Make do and Mend' and have been cutting and sewing with some fab results.

This week Year 6 have been finishing their History topic exploring the legacy of the Ancient Greek era. It has been surprising and interesting to discover that many features of society today are all down to the Ancient Greeks.

#### FACTS AND CHALLENGES

#### Geography

#### **Winter Solstice**

The winter solstice is the shortest day of the year, but also brings the promise of more daylight ahead. For people in the Northern Hemisphere (above the Equator, like the <u>United States</u>), winter is a season of cold, dark days—and if you're lucky, lots of snow to sled on! The winter solstice marks the exact moment when half of <u>Earth</u> is tilted the farthest away from the sun. It usually happens on December 21 or 22, at the exact same second around the world.

Because less sunlight reaches Earth, the winter solstice is also the day of the year with the least amount of daytime, known as the shortest day of the year. But the good news is that every day after the winter solstice will be a little longer, until we reach the day with the most hours of daylight. Called the summer solstice, it usually occurs between June 20 and June 22. For people who live in the Southern Hemisphere, though, the winter solstice takes place in June. That's because the seasons are reversed below the Equator. For instance, in <a href="New Zealand">New Zealand</a>, it can actually snow in July!



Just like preparing your child to ride a bike for the first time, there are things we can do as parents to make our childrens online experience as safe as possible.



# Pick the device

Basic phones can message and make calls but children will not be able to access apps

# **Helmet - Parental Controls**

2 Before giving your child any device make sure you access parental controls and discuss apps you are happy for them to access

# **Brakes - Stop and Think**

3 Teach children to stop and think before they reshare information or reply to comments.

# Protection - Block and report

Teach your children how to block and report on the games and apps they are using.

# Stabilizers - Tech free areas

Keep technology out of bedrooms and charge devices downstairs
