A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

The children in Foundation have enjoyed the Story of Jack and the Jelly Bean Sta<mark>lk, writing labels to set up a sweet shop. They have been learning about materials used in castles and created art in the style of Alma Thomas.</mark>

This week Year 1 have been exploring how to ask, write and respond to questions. In the role of Little Red Riding Hood and the wolf, there was excellent use of question words and punctuation. A particular favourite was: "What is that awful smell?"

Year 2 have been enjoying finding out about the artist Lowry and creating their own observational drawings using pencil, charcoal and paint. We have also been learning about Meerkats in our English writing and have been using technical vocabulary to improve our ideas and statement sentences. In maths we have been learning about different coins and notes in our topic Money. We are learning to calculate coins, notes and change.

Yea 3 have been learning Volcanoes and this week have considered the pros and cons of living next to a Volcano. They have also been writing their newspaper reports linked to the story of Escape from Pompeii.

In Science Y4 was learning in Science about the function of the teeth, we continued to read the our exciting book: The great food bank heist. Based on the story, in English, we have written the story opening using fronted adverbials and extended noun phrases.

In Year 5 this week we have been writing a narrative based on Michael Morpurgo's Kensuke's Kingdom. Year five have worked really hard to use adventurous vocabulary and as a result have some very vivid descriptions of the island that Michael finds himself upon.

This week in Art Year 6 have been exploring the different ways that artists use shading to create light and dark in still life to make objects look 3 dimensional. They explored colour mixing of different tones of one colour to create a painting of an apple. They had to use the different tones that they made to create the light and dark in their painting to make the apple appear 3D.

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

Jesus announces his mission to the people of Nazareth by quoting the prophet Isaiah. Jesus was always faithful in worship and reading Scripture. We also treat our book of Scripture with reverence and respect. We have a special place for it beside a lighted candle, we process with it, the priest kisses the book and handles it with reverence. Just as Jesus did we know it is the Word of God for us today and always.

Do we recognise that when we listen to scripture being read to us we are listening to God speaking to us through the words we hear? Perhaps we might try to read a passage slowly and reflectively two or three times, allowing time for particular words or phrases to touch us, and spending time with these words. Allow them to connect with our personal situations, relationships, decisions. Jesus told his listeners that his mission was to bring the good news to the poor, set the captives free, give sight to the blind, and freedom to those who suffer. In what practical way can I bring good news to someone who is going through a tough time today?

FACTS AND CHALLENGES

Geography Spotlight

National Geographic Scientists have discovered the world's largest coral growing in waters of the Solomon Islands.

The Solomon Islands are located in the South-West Pacific. The healthy coral which is called Pavona Clavus, is over 32 metres long. This is longer than a blue whale! It's also 34m wide and 5.5m high. It is so big it can be seen from space!

The coral is mostly brown in colour, but it also has vivid yellow, blue and red dots. It is made of one billion tiny individual creatures called polyps. They have grown together for at least 300 Years. The coral is home to lots of marine species including reef fish, crabs and shrimps.
