This week, Year 1 have been so excited to have received a special letter from Beegu, a little yellow alien. They are currently learning how to write a letter back with all the features and information. We cannot wait to see what happens next.

In Year 2 this week we have been researching different animals living in Kenya and finding out about their lives. We have been using search engines to search and locate interesting facts to help us understand how they live. We have also been learning about multiplication and division in our maths work - finding out how many groups of different numbers can make a larger number. We are beginning to learn to recite our times tables and recall multiplication facts off by heart. In English this week we have been learning Animals poems from the 'Carnival of the Animals' book by Michael Morpurgo. We even created our very own 'Who are you?' poem today looking at different features.

Year 3 have really enjoyed our hot seating this week, taking on the roles of reporter and villager. They have ask and answered some really interesting questions related to our English Book, Escape from Pompeii.

Y4 this week experimented during the Science lesson, we have been investigating if the standard toothpaste is better than mix of toothpaste with bicarbonate of soda for cleaning the chocolate stains of the plates. The results were very surprising and different from our predictions. We also, celebrated the National Storytelling Week by joining the workshop of children's author Tola Okogwu and we enjoyed reading the new class book Iron Man by Ted Hughes.

In Year 5 this week we have been working to create stop motion animations. We created a plasticine figure and slowly moved it taking hundreds of pictures. We then put those pictures together to create some fantastic animations.

This week Year 6 had their class Mass with Fr. Paul. It was a very special time spent together reflecting on the importance of taking time to be quiet and still to listen to God. They thought about the Gospel story of The Road to Emaus when two of the disciples walked and talked with Jesus about the wonders of faith, without even realizing they were with Jesus. It is important to remember that Jesus can appear to us in many ways and through other people to guide us during difficult times.

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

Because of the crowds, Jesus climbed into Simon's boat to teach. Later he told Peter to go out deeper and put his nets into the sea. Why did Peter not think this was a good idea? Despite being tired and disappointed he trusted Jesus enough to do as Jesus asked. Did Peter and his friends manage to catch any fish that day? How would they have felt? What would this have told them about Jesus? What did they do when Jesus invited them to follow him?

Just as Jesus asked Simon Peter to take a risk by going back out into deep water, so he asks us to take a risk for him too. Our deep water may be way over our heads. Jesus asks us to have faith in him. Courage and boldness are what we require to answer 'yes' to the call to be Christian today. What is our response to the call of God to leave everything and follow him? Are there ways in which you are already sharing in the task of being a 'fisher' of people? App - Red Note

With the possible demise of TikTok in the U.<mark>S. Meta</mark> (Facebook and Instagram) are trying to entice

TikTok users onto their platforms, other apps are trying to move in on the popularity. One such app which appears to have come out of nowhere is Red Note. Like TikTok it comes from China and is in the top 10 charts in the UK. FACTS AND CHALLENGES


Fun Geography facts to impress your friends and family with!

CROSS COUNTRY




A huge congratulations to our cross country competitors. Both the boys and girls teams took third place among a number of other schools in the area - Well done!
