A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHER

As Foundation come to the end of their topic Around the World, the ch<mark>ildren enjoyed a quiz to find out</mark> what they remembered! They enjoyed watching the year 3/4 play and learning in class about what happened on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

This week Year 1 have made their coats for a teddy. To complete their DT learning this term, the children had to consult their designs, cut out a template, use this to cut their fabric, make pockets and decorations they had planned, waterproof the fabric by layering sticky back plastic and finally joining the pieces to make a completed product. The results were amazing!

In Year 2 this week we have been learning about Spalding Flower parade and the Grower's Association. We learnt about the connection between the Tulip Week and the Jubilee and how the Grower's association created a 25 mile tour of the Tulip fields. We have also been learning about how we react in Physical Education to the whistle or to another player in our team games. We have also been using the Examen prayer to reflect on our own actions and behaviours.

Year 3 enjoyed discussing their views on their soup making and eating and have enjoyed the scientific investigations regarding force, motion and friction.

Year 4 have had a great time this week outdoor learning with Mrs Simons. They made a giant Iron Man sculpture out of natural materials and went on a bug hunt.

In Year 5 this week we have been exploring charts and data, both in our maths and computing sessions. We have been reading and interpreting data and using ICT to present a range of data in different ways.

This week Year 6 have been working on their RE and DT project to complete Stations of the Cross for a whole school reflection on Friday. They have worked in pairs on a station to complete a wooden frame structure, create prayers and reflections, an image representing the station and program a Microbit to create a flashing number and image. The children have developed so many skills across the curriculum including: measuring accurately, using saws and hot glue guns, computer programming, sketching and drawing, creative writing to name but a few. The children have absolutely loved working on the this project and have shown a mature attitude and fabulous teamwork.

What a busy term we have had filled with learning and enriching events such as our Alice in Wonderland Workshops, Zoology Lab Visit, CAFOD Assembly, Big Lent Walk, Neurodiversity Week and much much more! I am sure you are all ready for a well earned rest and some quality family time over the coming Easter break and we look forward to seeing you for a new term of adventure and learning on Tuesday 22nd April.



CROSS COUNTRY

As it was a team effort, our top 5 runners from each race handed in their places and these were totalled. There were 7 schools taking part and overall our Y5/6 boys came 4th with a special mention to Thiofi (Y5) who came 3rd in the race. Our Y5/6 girls came 3rd, with Maya C (6th), Daria (12th), Maddie (14th), Othula (16th) and Isabella (21st) all receiving medals! Our Y3/4 boys came 4th with a special mention to Max who came 3rd (Y4) in the race. Our Y3/4 girls came 5th overall, however Milita (Y3) came in first overall and received a School Games t-shirt! A huge well done to all the runners who took part!
