In Foundation the children have enjoyed learning about some important jobs our minibeasts do. They have been thinking about how to care for God's wonderful world and have been looking for bugs.

This week, Year 1 have been learning to chop, grate and zest different ingredients that could go into a fruity cake. They learned how to make a bridge shape and used a sharp knife through the tunnel safely. They definitely enjoyed eating what they had chopped and have started to plan which fruit or veg they would like to put in their own cupcake product.

Year 2 have been reviewing our learning on adjectives and nouns. We have been challenging ourselves in maths to recognise and apply our times tables knowledge in our daily Maths. We have also been learning about Pictograms and sorting in Science, recording our findings and sharing scientific information.

This week Year 3 have been very excited about the puppets they are designing and making this term.

A busy week for Year 4 this week, firstly the girls visited the High School for a taster morning, we studied geography and science, great solving skills were needed to find out what the unknown liquid was, and which teacher had switched the labels of them. The boys went over to the Grammar School and enjoyed history and science lessons, and designed shields after learning about heraldry. The next day we walked to Ayscoughfee Gardens and used our sculptures to bring Art to the gardens; we used our iPads to photograph the models in different settings and had a busy morning exploring our local surroundings.

This week in Year 5 we have started exploring the work of William Shakespeare. We have been reading the Tempest and have enjoyed interpreting the meaning and acting out some of the scenes.

This week Year 6 have been writing a review about Wicked, which they were lucky to experience last week. They explored the technical vocabulary linked to theatre and their meanings and investigated ambitious vocabulary that they could use to describe different aspects of the show, such as: mesmerizing, spinetingling, whimsical and soaring.

The purpose of an oath was to guarantee the truthfulness of the statement made. Sometimes this can be very good. For example, many of the Sacraments involve making a public vow before God and the Church. In these cases, the vow is a form of oath that is solemnized so as to invite the grace of God to enter and strengthen it. It becomes a way of making a public witness to one's faith and an expression of one's need for God's grace to be faithful to the promise that is made.

For Parents - Pinterest Privacy and Safety Settings

Pinterest is an enormous and hugely popular platform. Known as a 'visual discovery engine' which basically means it is a user-to-user platform, meaning that individual users upload content for anyone else to see. You can use it for a variety of things to get ideas, create mood boards, scrapbooks and so much more. I use it myself for inspiration for my drawing projects.

But because it is user to user there will be content that isn't suitable for everyone. Back in 2022, during the inquest into the death of a 14 year old, even Pinterest admitted the platform wasn't safe.


