ESSAGE FROM MRS WITH

The children have enjoyed learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and have been writing 'Superworms' chants. In Maths they have been exploring grouping and sharing. With the warm weather here, they are enjoying our outdoor kitchen, cooking food on the BBQ and making ice lollies too!

Year 1 have been using some excellent vocabulary in theory English this week. We used fabu<mark>lous verbs and adjectives to</mark> improve sentences and learned some interesting new words for the rough ocean waves such as swells and breakers. The children were very engaged when discussing shades of meaning to help us with word choices for 'big'

In Year 2 this week we have been completing our Optional KS1 SATs tests. We have been using and applying our maths strategies to solve and complete problems, whilst also using our arithmetic skills to calculate answers to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division questions. In English we have been reading texts and answering questions, looking for key words or phrases to find information. We have also been learning how to thread needles and complete a running stitch in Design Technology.

Year 3 are excited by the next stage in their DT project as they are actually cutting out their designs today ready for stitching to begin. They have thoroughly enjoyed the History Session with Now Press Play and enjoyed being the hunters with their bows and arrows in the Stone age and coming face to face with WOLLY MAMOTH. The drama session was brilliant, their expressions and immersion into this era was great to watch. The children become totally immersed when experiencing the Now Press Play sessions.

Year 4 have had a great time this week learning about the rise of the Roman empire and the role played by Julius Caesar. They have learnt that Claudius became the first emperor. They are enjoying their new class book The Girl Who Stole an Elephant by Nizrana Farook. In DT the children have also been learning about textiles, font sizes and types as well as contracting and complementary colours as they plan their cushion designs.

In Year 5 this week we have been learning about negative numbers in maths. We have been counting in different multiples, crossing zero and have been very successful in solving problems involving negative numbers.

This week Year 6 have started exploring mobile phone cases in their Design Technology lessons. They have been looking at different mobile case designs considering the design criteria, aesthetics, target audience and functionality. Everyone is very excited to start designing and making their own felt phone case in the coming weeks.

It has been a busy and beautiful week here at school and we have enjoyed welcoming another work experience student from Bourne Academy in Year 2-the class have enjoyed working with Mr Viera. SUBJECT HIGHLIGHTS

We are approaching- Plastic Free July- 3 plastic facts

Plastic was invented in1907, plastic is material made from crude oil. It was once know as 'the material of 1,000 uses,' it is cheap, flexible and strong and it's used for everything, from packaging to clothes and even chewing gum.

Plastic can take over 500 years to break down, and even then, it never fully disappears. Worse, lots of plastic is designed to only be used once. If it's not recycled plastic waste is burned, buried or ends up as litter, causing pollution in nature.

The biggest problem is that we are using and throwing away too much plastic. In the UK each household bins about 60 pieces of plastic packaging every week, which adds up to over 90 billion bits per year across the country. Sadley figures reported by Green peace in 2024 suggest only 17% plastic is recycled.

You ca help by using less plastic this coming July, try and reduce your use of singe use plastic for ideas look at www.natgeokids.com/uk/plastic for some great tips.


