The Foundation children have finished writing their stories about The Very Hungry Caterpillar, what lovely ideas they have had and looking at how they have developed their writing skills is amazing! In maths they have been counting beyond 10 and looking at what two digit numbers are made up of. They have also been on a minibeast hunt with our Now Press Play Experience.

This week, Year 1 have been so busy! We enjoyed watching the Y6 play, had a water safety tal<mark>k, tested our maths</mark> skills and investigated materials. In addition, the children combined all their chopping baking and decorating skills to make some incredible cupcakes with a fruit or vegetable added in. They were beautiful and delicious! On Thursday the children also took part in an excellent workshop about the life and achievements of Neil Armstrong, led by One Day Creative. The children engaged in quizzes, drama and role play- putting their history knowledge to the test.

This week in Year 2 we have been looking at The Marvellous Squishy Fluffy Itty Bitty in English and discussing rich vocabulary we can use to describe the very fluffy pink character! We have enjoyed learning and using pictograms in our Maths statistics topic and have been using pictograms, tally marks and block graphs to present our data. We have also been using our research skills to find out more about the life of Grace Darling and have enjoyed an amazing workshop sharing key facts and mini-dramas to help us learn about the past.

Year 3 have really enjoyed talking and writing about their trip to Flag Fen, they are still buzzing from the trip. They are also excited about their DRT project and excited that they will be taking their hand puppets that they have designed, cut out and sewn together home to show their parents.

Year 4 have been busy this week looking at statistics. They have been interpreting line graphs ad bar charts, creating pictograms and asking and answering questions about data. In RE we have been looking at the Catholic virtues of faith, hope and charity, children have been scripture detective making links between these virtues and the 1<sup>st</sup> letter to The Corinthians. Children have begun to explore a new exciting text in Guided reading entitled 'The Great Highland Falcon Thief'. This is an award winning adventure story by G. M. Leonard and Sam Sedgman. I would thoroughly recommend this book as an excellent summer read for children. In our PE learning we have been learning rallying skills, celebrating the great British sporting event Wimbledon.

In Year 5 this week, we have been reading The Whale by Ethan and Vita Murrow. In this picture book, two children set off on an adventure to prove the Giant Whale sighting 50 years earlier was not a hoax. We have enjoyed making inferences from the book and have been working hard to prepare writing our eye witness accounts.

Year 6 this week, were busy performing the leavers play for the whole school and their families and friends. In Maths they have been learning how to interpret the dual bar charts and in DT they were learning about design criteria for a mobile phone cases.
