

A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHER

Children in Foundation have settled well into daily routines, demonstrating increasing independence through their self-help skills, such as tidying up, managing their belongings, and following familiar transitions with confidence. They have successfully learned four phonemes and are beginning to blend these sounds to read simple CVC words, showing enthusiasm and growing confidence in early reading

Year 1 have been learning about nouns this week. They have been able to identify common and proper nouns and looking at them in a singular and plural form. In Geography they have created an ariel picture of

Year 2 had a lovely day on Wednesday outdoor learning linked to their geography, exploring the woodland area, playing forest school games, and working in teams to make dens. They had lots of fun, fresh air and explored our beautiful natural environment.

This week, Year 3 have been reviewing the work of Henri Rousseau and his painting 'Surprised'. They have considered the colour, texture and lines in the painting to create a collage of the work themselves. In RE they have been learning about St. Francis and how he cared for creation, they have considered the feelings of St. Francis about the world today.

This week in Year 4 has been full of exciting learning! In geography, the children have been exploring the layers of the rainforest. In Maths, we travelled back in time to learn about Roman numerals. The class practised reading and writing numbers in this ancient system. During PE, the focus was on safe play in catch games. The children discussed strategies for avoiding others, such as changing direction quickly, keeping eyes up, and using space wisely. This helped everyone stay active, safe, and full of laughter!

In Year 5 this week we have been exploring air resistance. We have planned an investigation into how to maximise the effect of air resistance by making effective parachutes and are looking forward to testing our theories next week.

This week 20 of Year 6 headed off the The Briars on their residential retreat- watch this space next week for an update. The children that remained in school still had time to have their own fun. They learnt about tornadoes and created some colourful tornado pictures using water colour pencils and got creative making a poster explaining The Fajita Scale, a scale that is used to categorise the seriousness of the tornado.

Notice: Several of you have asked if we can be flexible with uniform and allow polo shirts and shorts for those warmer days with regards to uniform. I am happy to facilitate this but if we can all ensure we are in Winter Uniform after half term. It is especially important to have full school smart winter uniform for School Photograph days. This week has been wet and windy but that has not stopped our curriculum adventures and I can see several classes are already full steam ahead booking in the first enrichment trips and visits of the year. For Parents - Roblox

Update As the most popular game on the planet with children, Roblox gets a lot of coverage and understandably so. It's an amazing platform to explore but it isn't without its faults, some of which are very significant.

In April 2025 Revealing Reality carried out an investigation into Roblox due to serious concerns of what children were experiencing within the game (link HERE).

In September they carried out a followup investigation to see what, if anything had changed. In short, quite a lot has changed, such as:

- Adjustments to content maturity ratings.
- · ID verification for certain games and experiences.
- Stricter moderation Enhanced parental controls.

These are good but, according to Revealing Reality, they don't go far enough. There are still workarounds and very significant concerns. It's worth having a read of the full report which you can find HERE.

<u>Geography</u>

Hurricane Planes

Brave scientists are flying directly into powerful storms all in the name of research. There are only two planes built in the world to specifically fly inside a hurricane. Their mission is to collect data about the hurricane. By discovering things like the exact centre of the storm these researchers will help weather forecasters more accurately predict when and where a hurricane will make landfall and how strong it will be, this information could save lives! Scientists on board the plane track the storm using a Doppler radar, a tool that bounces signals off the storm to track its structure. Wow how amazing science and geography coming together to save lives and help us learn more about hurricanes!



Snapchat



What is Snapchat?

Snapchat is a messaging app where users (13+) can send and receive messages, videos and pictures

Disappearing messages

Snapchat's servere are designed to automatically delete all Snaps after they've been viewed. These disappearing messages create the perfect conditions for cyberbullying, online predators, and secretive behaviour that's hard to track. Just because the message 'disappear' from the chat, screenshots still allow them to be saved.

Location Sharing

Sharing your location Potential Dangers:

- Safety Concerns
- Stalking and Harassment
- Unwanted Attention
- Privacy Violations
- Account Compromise
- Obsessive Behaviour

"Ghost Mode" allows you to hide your location on the Snap Map, making it invisible to other users, and can be turned on and off or set with a timer.

- contact with strangers grooming

Reporting and Blocking

On Snapchat, you can report concerning content or accounts by pressing and holding on the content or the Snapchatter's name and selecting "Report". Blocking a user prevents them from viewing your Story, sending you Snape, or chatting with you.

Family Centre

Family Centre helps parents get more insight into who their teens are friends with on Snapchat, and who they have been communicating with, while still respecting their teens' privacy and autonomy.

Parents can -

- View their child's friends list
- See which profiles have been newly added
 See who their teens have recently interacted
- with


 Limit their child's exposure to sensitive content
