A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

This week in EYFS, the children have been busy learning and exploring in a variety of exciting ways! In maths, they have been focusing on shapes, and the children have made great progress in recognising circles and triangles. They have also been learning about the important role of a police officer in our community, discussing how they help keep us safe. The children got creative as they wrote medical cards for the animals visiting the vet—this was a fun and imaginative way to practice writing skills. And, of course, the excitement is building as they have started practicing for the nativity!

This week, Year 1 worked hard to prepare and deliver a beautiful Celebration of the Word all about Mary's hope. They shared their learning, sang and signed special prayers and even choreographed their own dance. Miss Whyles was so proud. Also a big thank you to the parents to joined in with our candle prayers, we know it can be daunting being given a job to do!

This week in Year 2, we have been adding two two-digit numbers that cross ten in our maths work, as well as subtracting one-digit numbers from two-digit numbers. In English, we have enjoyed creating sentences using commas and developing our use of adjectives to build extended noun phrases. We have also been learning about the Nativity story and have begun to practise our lines and songs for the performance.

Year 3 have had a fantastic week of learning! In swimming, the children have shown great determination as they practised their backstroke, making wonderful progress through perseverance and effort.

In English, the class have begun drafting their poems inspired by The Tower, and their creativity has truly shone through each poem has been fantastic in its own unique way.

This week, Year 4 have been exploring the idea of Christ the King as part of our RE learning. We discussed what it means to be a leader, how Jesus is portrayed as a different kind of king. In History, we have explored the creatin of the Roman Empire, discovering how Rome grew from a small city into a powerful civilisation.

In Year five this week we have been learning about the start of William the Conquerors reign. We explored some of the previous Saxon kings of England and how it came to be that William became king.

This week Year 6 have been learning about fractions! They have been drawing on their knowledge of multiples and factors to simplify and find equivalent fractions. This has enabled them to compare, order as well as add and subtract different fractions.

Jubilee for Schools Celebration Day: This event is a day of celebration and reflection on the impact of the Jubilee Year, which has focused on faith, learning, and transformative action. Resources for planning the day are provided to schools by organizations like CAFOD.

Each class has a completed an activity centred around different themes including: Care for Creation, Food Poverty, Forgiveness and Healing and Rest and Worship. They have worked together in pairs and groups to explore ways we can work together as a church community to make a difference.

Climate Change some facts

Climate change or global warming, is the process of our planet heating up.

Scientists estimate that since the Industrial Revolution, human activity has caused the Earth to warm by approximately 1°C. While that might not sound like much, it means big things for people and wildlife around the globe.

Unfortunately, rising temperatures don't just mean that we'll get nicer weather. The changing climate will actually make our weather more extreme and unpredictable. As temperatures rise, some areas will get wetter and lots of animals and humans! could find they're not able to adapt to their changing climate. 


Books to Explore:


Zero the number that almost Wasn't
