A MESSAGE FROM MRS WITHERS

EYFS children have been busy preparing for the Nativity! They've learned the songs, explored positional language, and discovered the story of Jesus' birth in a stable. They've also been practicing a special music piece with instruments for the showcase!

This week, Year 1 have been working hard on their bridge decks in DT, learning how to fold, add layers and struts to strengthen. They planned, experimented and tested to see if their bridge decks could hold a heavy toy adapting as they went. Fabulous engagement and application of knowledge.

Year 2 have had a wonderful and very busy week! The children have been working hard rehearsing their Nativity, learning their songs, practising their actions, and bringing the story of the birth of Jesus to life with great enthusiasm. They have really enjoyed acting out their parts and celebrating this very special story together. Alongside all the festive excitement, the class has also been busy completing their assessments in Spelling, Punctuation, Reading, and Maths. We are very proud of how sensibly and confidently they approached their work. Well done, Year 2!

Year 3 have had a fantastic week of learning. In English, we began exploring our new book The Pebble in My Pocket and looked at the features of letter writing. The children were fascinated in History as we learned more about Stone Age life—especially the fact that there were no shops, TVs or computers!

In Maths, the class have started their new unit on multiplication and division and are working very hard. We also had another great swimming session, revisiting important water-safety skills and practising swimming on both front and back, with some even trying treading water in the deep end.

Well done on another brilliant week, Year 3!

This week, Year 4 have been busy exploring low and high sounds in Science. Students investigated how sound is made and experimented with different materials to discover what affects pitch.

In Maths, the class practised solving multiplication problems using their 3, 6, and 9 times tables, building confidence and speed through games and challenges.

During Design & Technology, pupils began designing their own torches to meet a specific design brief. They sketched ideas, considered suitable materials, and explored how simple circuits work to bring their designs to life. It's been a fantastic week of creativity, curiosity, and problem-solving!

In Year 5 this week we have been learning about fractions. We have been finding equivalent fractions and comparing and ordering fractions less than one. We have been very successful and have learnt some good tricks for ordering fractions.

This week Year 6 have been hard at work experiencing SATs test. It has been a good opportunity for them to practice exam technique and find out the different areas of knowledge that they need further revision on. Everyone has tried really hard and taken a positive and mature attitude to the tests. They now wait in anticipation for their results.

Jubilee for Schools Celebration Day: This event is a day of celebration and reflection on the impact of the Jubilee Year, which has focused on faith, learning, and transformative action. Resources for planning the day are provided to schools by organizations like CAFOD.

Each class has a completed an activity centered around different themes including: Care for Creation, Food Poverty, Forgiveness and Healing and Rest and Worship. They have worked together in pairs and groups to explore ways we can work together as a church community to make a difference.

GOSPEL REFLECTION OF THE WEEK

Jesus came to earth the first time as a baby - we remember this and celebrate it at Christmas. We know that one day he will return, but we don't know when. During Advent we think about the second coming of Jesus - we must be ready. Jesus tells us what sort of lives we must lead in preparation for this time. The Advent wreath helps us to focus on these things - its circle of greenery represents God's unending love, and the candles represent Jesus, the Light of the World. There are three violet and one pink one. The four candles are lit consecutively on the four Sundays of Advent. Today we light the first violet one.

Reflect this week on the needs of others, and how we can respond to these; your own self – where you are in life and what things need to change; where God is in the ordinariness of your daily life.

Make time each day to watch and listen. Engage in times of silent prayer.
