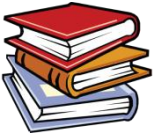






Miss Bools's and the Year 6 Reading Ambassadors' Recommended Reads!





"There is no such thing as a child who hates to read; there are only children who have not found the right book."

	Popcorn	Robert Harrell	<p>Andrew's just trying to get through school photo day with one aim: a photo of him which his mum will like. But today of all days, the world seems out to get him. There's a bully, the science experiment gone wrong, scary news about his grandmother, and someone else's juice snot (don't ask). Andrew struggles with anxiety, and the little kernel of worry in his stomach is getting hotter and hotter . . .</p> <p>Can he make it through the day without popping?</p>
	Zak Monroe is (not) My Friend	Simon Packham	<p>Sam has been best friends with Cal, Fin and Jay for EVER. They're all about to move up to a new school together - scary but exciting. But then he overhears them saying they're not going to put him on their Friends Lists! So Sam will be stuck in a different tutor group with a lot of kids he doesn't know.</p> <p>Help!</p> <p>How can Sam convince them to change their minds?</p> <p>Can he keep on hiding his new friendship with 'weird' new boy Zak Monroe? And what will happen when these two sides of Sam's life collide?</p>

	Murder Most Unladylike	Robin Stevens	<p>At Deepdean School for Girls, Daisy Wells and Hazel Wong have set up their own detective agency. But they are struggling to find any <i>real</i> crimes to investigate. (Unless you count the case of Lavinia's missing tie. Which they don't.)</p> <p>Then Hazel discovers the Science Mistress, Miss Bell, lying dead in the Gym. To add to the mystery, when she and Daisy return five minutes later, the body has disappeared. Now Hazel and Daisy not only have a murder to solve: they have to prove one happened in the first place.</p>
	The Bubble Boy	Stewart Foster	<p>Eleven-year-old Joe can't remember a life outside of his hospital room, with its beeping machines and view of London's rooftops. His condition means he's not allowed outside, not even for a moment, and his few visitors risk bringing life-threatening germs inside his 'bubble'. But then someone new enters his world and changes it for ever.</p>
	Classic Read Alex Rider- Stormbreaker	Anthony Horowitz	<p>Nothing prepares 14-year-old Alex Rider for the news that the uncle he thought he knew was really a spy for MI6 - Britain's top-secret intelligence agency.</p> <p>Forcibly recruited into MI6 himself, and armed with top-secret, state-of-the-art gadgets, Alex is sent to finish his uncle's final mission - a mission that involves a wealthy sinister businessman and his new tech creation: a super computer called Stormbreaker.</p> <p>The stakes are high and things are about to get deadly. . .</p>
